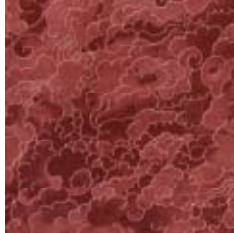

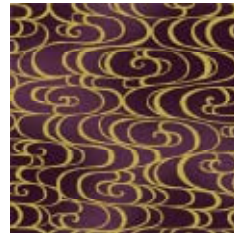

- 3 12 1/2" squares
- Optional border
- Cut 6 • 6" Strips WOF

Cher 04 Wine



- 1 7 1/4" square, cross cut on both diagonals
- 1 6 7/8" square, cut on one diagonal
- 14 7" squares
- 2 6 1/2" squares

Cher 03 Wine



- 1 7 1/4" square, cross cut on both diagonals
- 1 6 7/8" square, cut on one diagonal
- 19 7" squares
- 6 6 1/2" squares

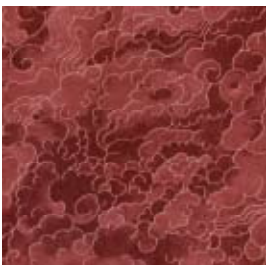
Cher 05 Sand



- 1 7 1/4" square, cross cut on both diagonals
- 1 6 7/8" square, cut on one diagonal
- 13 7" squares
- 5 6 1/2" squares

Optional border
Cut 6 • 2" Strips WOF

Rain 08 Rose



- 2 7 1/4" squares, cross cut on both diagonals
- 1 6 7/8" square, cut on one diagonal
- 18 7" squares

Binding 1/2 yard for quilt without borders
5/8 yards for quilt with border

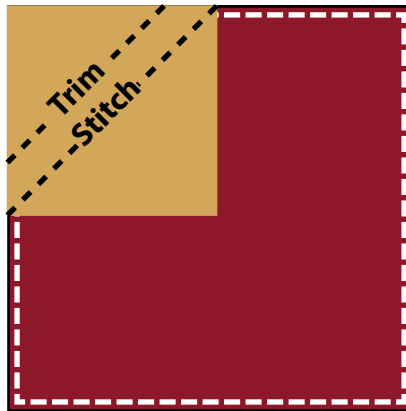
Backing 3 yards for quilt without borders
4 yards for quilt with border

Large Snowball Blocks

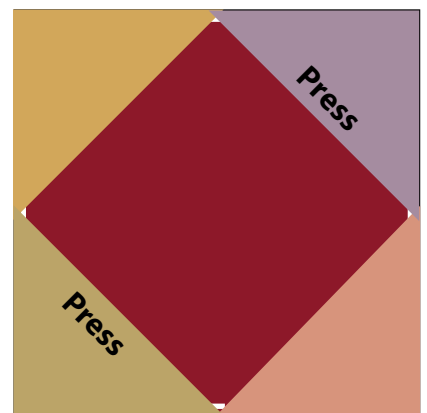
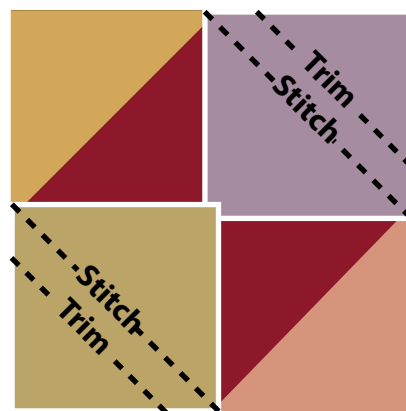
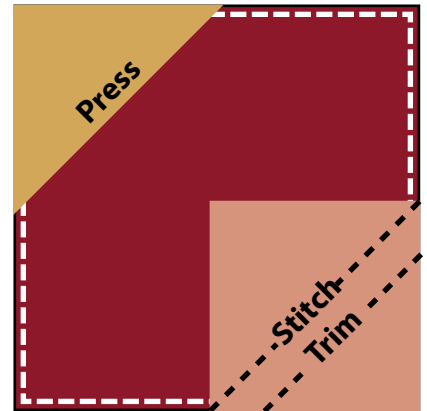
Make 3 Large Snowball Blocks using 12½" Nobu 73 red squares and by following the illustrations for 6½" corner fabrics.



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 6½" corner fabric. Place in upper left corner, right sides together with 12½" Nobu red fabric. Stitch on line. Trim ¼" away from stitching line and press.

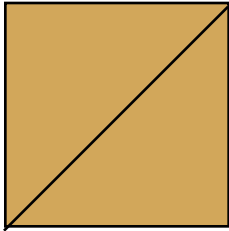


Repeat for lower right corner, then repeat for remaining two corners, being careful to follow the illustrations for fabric selection.

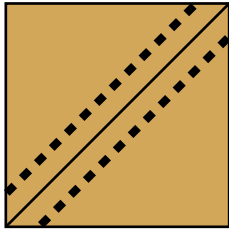


Half Square Triangle Blocks

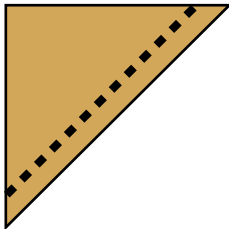
Using 7" squares of fabric, make half square triangle blocks.



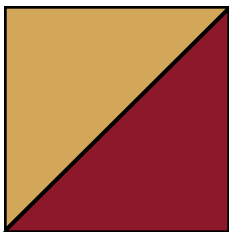
Draw a diagonal line across a 7" fabric square.



Stitch a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.



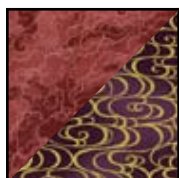
Cut along the drawn line.



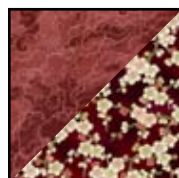
Press towards the darker fabric. Trim to 6 1/2".



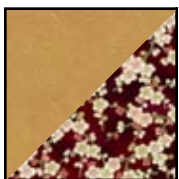

Quarter Square Triangle Blocks

Using 7 1/4" squares of fabric and 6 7/8" squares of fabric to make six quarter square triangle blocks, following illustrations for fabric placement.



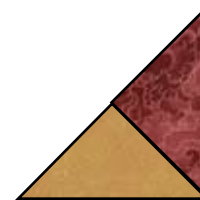
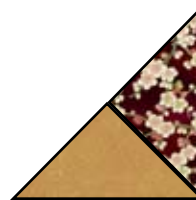
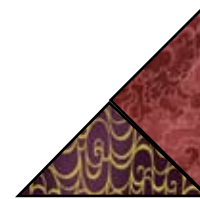
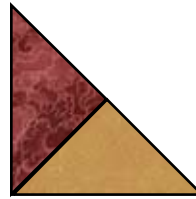
Cut the 7 1/4" squares of fabric on both diagonals



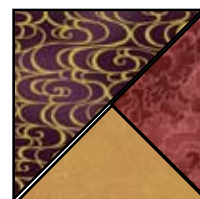
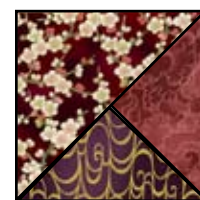
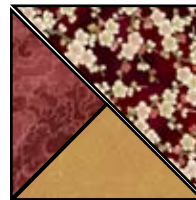
Cut the 6 7/8" squares of fabric on one diagonal.



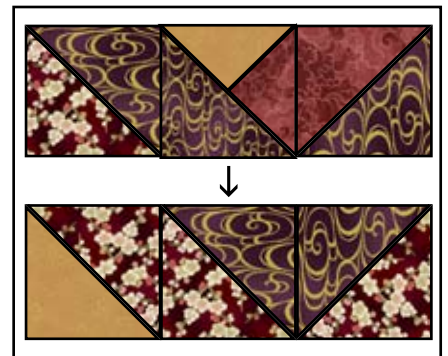
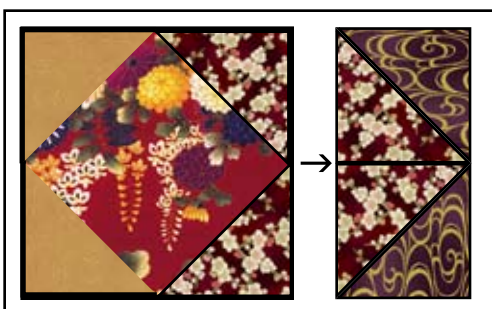
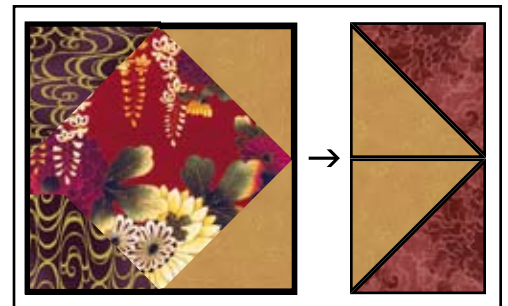
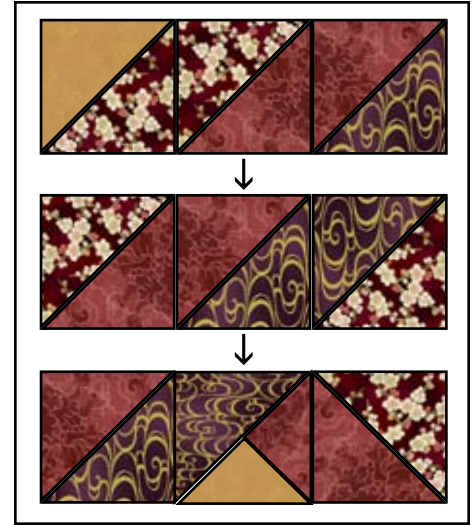
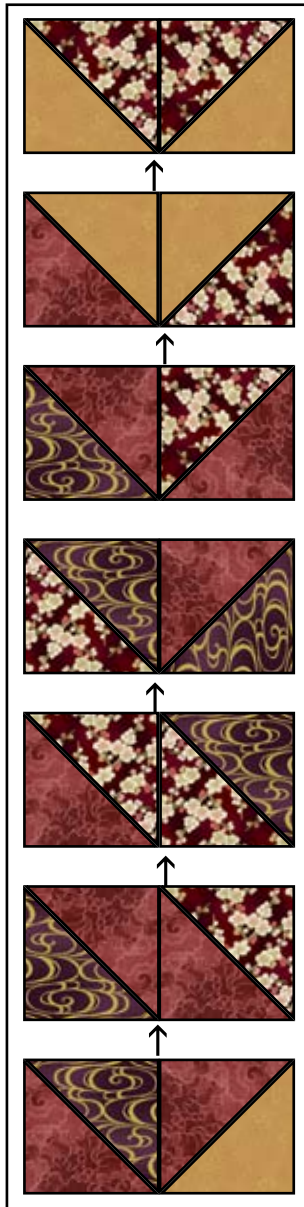
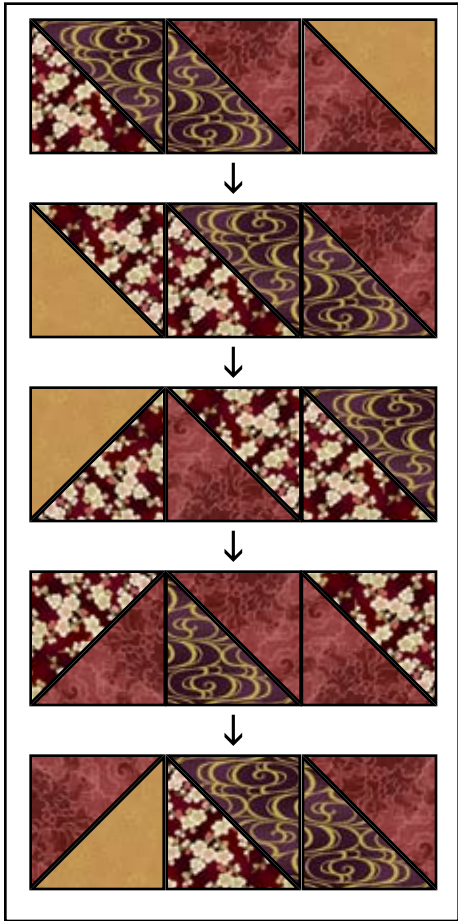
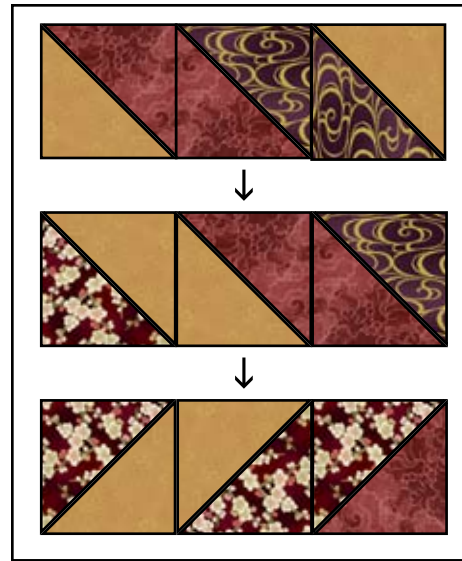
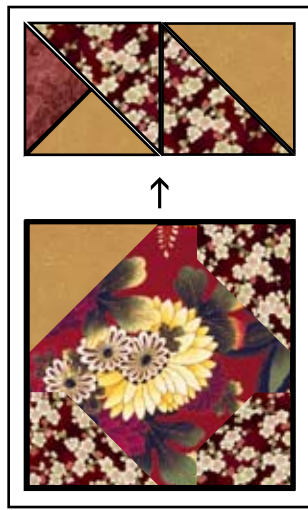
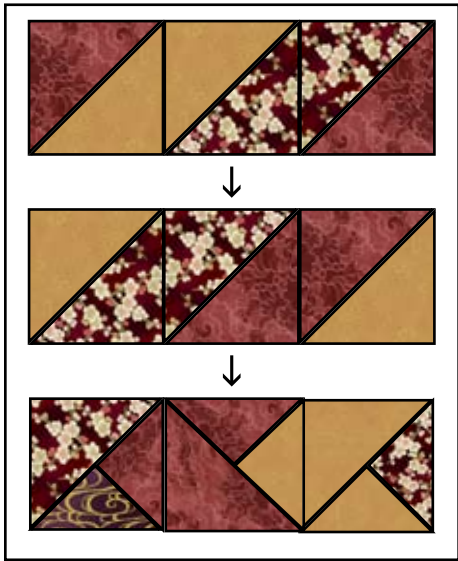
Sew two small triangles together. Press towards the darker fabric.

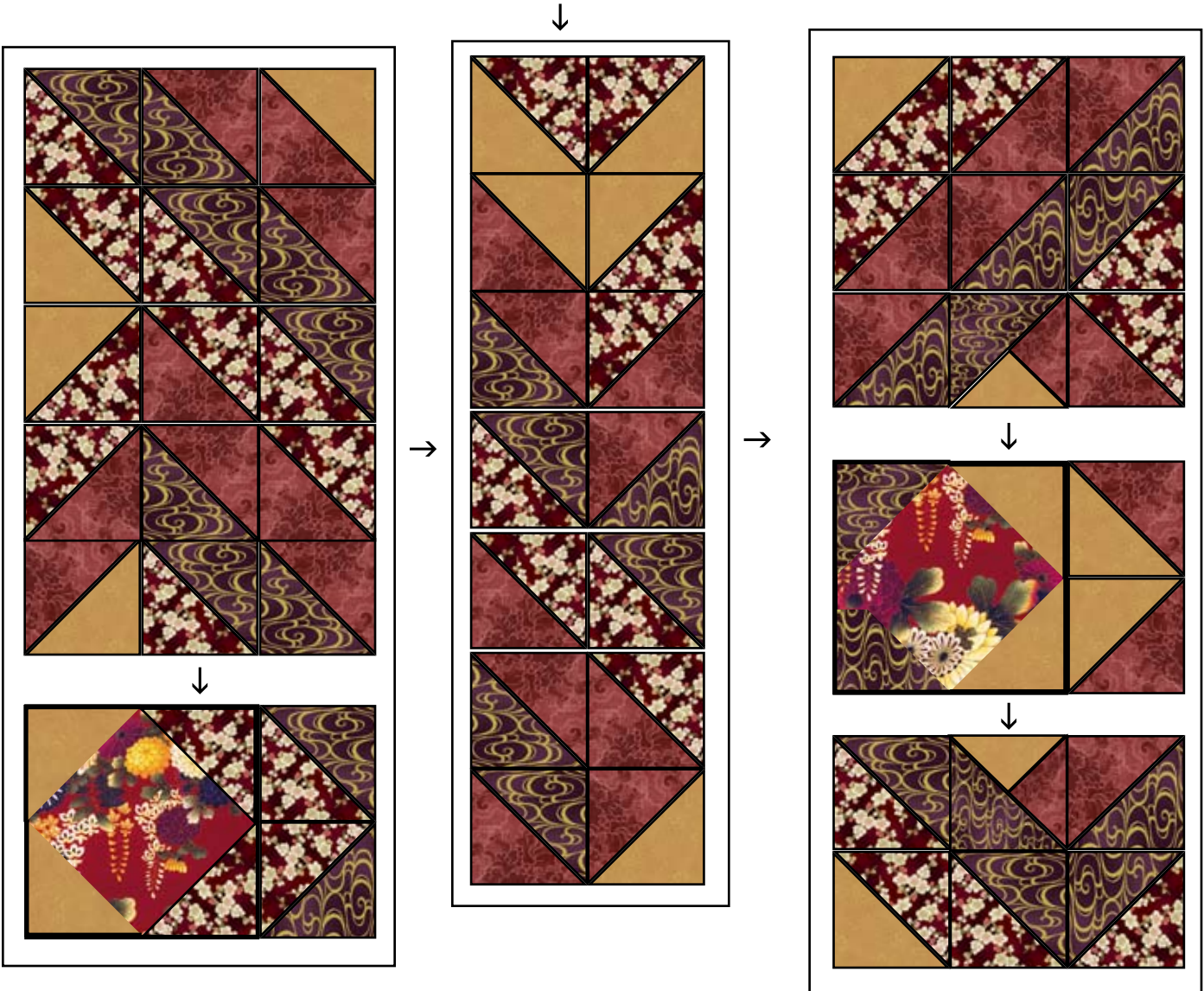
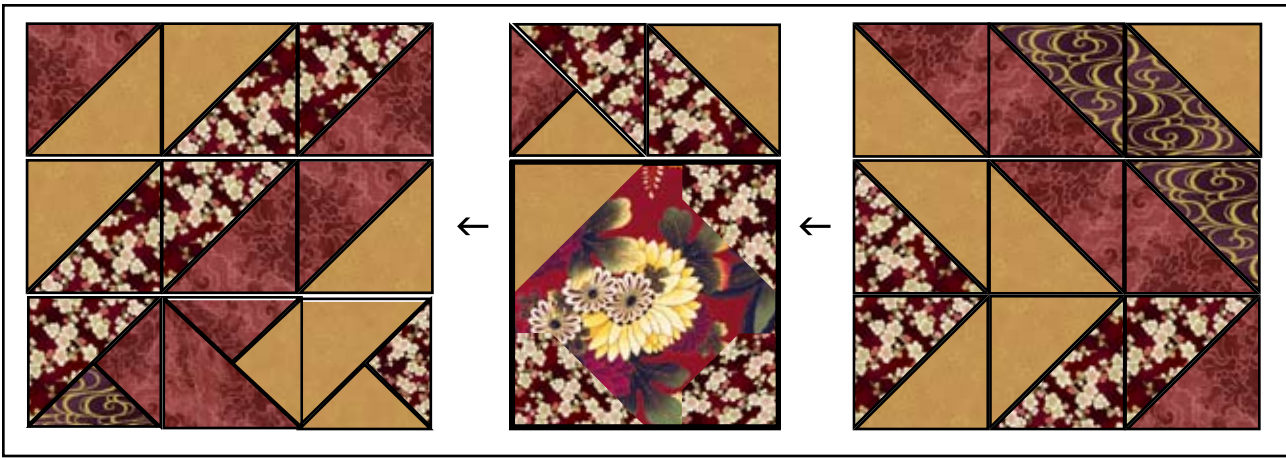


Sew larger triangles together to the two triangle units. Press towards the larger triangle.



Be careful not to distort the bias edges when making this block.





Quilting Ideas

Enhance the angular design by echo quilting along the color lines.

Or, to do an overall quilting design, use Kona Bay's Chou 01 and quilt from the back outlining the butterflies and flowers.
